
ON THE COVER: HEMEROCALLIS 'GLOWING QUASAR' DAYLILY







NOTES FROM THE GARDEN & NURSERY

ENTHUSIASM FOR EPIMEDIUMS

Being the Yew Dell Garden Manager comes with certain expectations. No matter that I've only been in my position for a short time, most visitors seem to think I have all the answers. Little do they know that I'm still learning, myself. After all this is a great big world with a gazillion plants! But I love a challenge and the opportunity learn and teach at the same time. So, I invite you to ask those tough questions (What weed is this? What plant did this leaf come from?) just remember, like all gardeners, I'm still learning too! What's the toughest question of all for me to answer? That's easy. What's your favorite plant? Now that really is a tough one.

As a plant lover this question is always the hardest, but at this moment, 9:44am on a Thursday, the answer is, Epimedium.

Epimedium (barrenwort) is an amazing group of plants. They thrive in full to part shade, don't mind dry soils and make a great ground cover. Their semi-evergreen foliage looks great almost year round. Of the dozens of forms in the Yew Dell collection, here are my 4 favorites – today!



Epimedium grandiflorum 'Yubae' Planted in 2007, this is the largest specimen I have encountered, measuring to a height of 15". The broad, heart shaped leaves have slightly serrated margins. The blooms are dainty and a blush pink color.



Epimedium xyoungianum 'Niveum' Planted in 2014, this specimen is smaller, measuring only 6" in height. The foliage is an asymmetrical heart shape and is slightly serrated. The best part of this selection is the robust pure white blooms in the spring.



Epimedium xversicolor 'Sulphuruem' Planted in 2009, this specimen is about 10" tall and creates a dense ground cover. The foliage is broad and egg shaped with a smoother margin than other Epimediums. The blooms are a beautiful yellow and cream color. In the early spring the new foliage displays a stunning red variegation which later fades to green.



Epimedium 'Pink Champagne' Planted in 2015, this specimen measures in at 10" tall. The foliage is a narrow heart shape with pronounced serrations on the margin. The blooms are dainty and display a striking pale and bright pink color. In the early spring the new foliage displays a remarkable red mottling with a pinkish margin which later fades to green.

ORGANIZED GARDENING... REALLY?

It seems to be ingrained in human culture. Saving things; pictures, stamps, yearbooks, and even your kid's baby teeth. When spring rolls around next year, you are undoubtedly going to go to your local garden center or annual plant sale and ask what that plant was you bought there last year. Although you remember it bloomed yellow, grew about one to seven feet tall, and had a slight lean to the left, we people in horticulture sales will still be befuddled.

It sounds simple, but saving and recording the specifics of plants in our gardens seems to be one of the greatest challenges for many garden folk and plant geeks. I wish I could tell you exactly what month and year we planted our phenomenal Magnolia macrophylla (Big Leaf Magnolia) in our garden in Shelbyville, but all I can narrow it down to is the spring of 2014 or 2015. That amazing coleus we had in our containers last year? My wife Emma and I would bicker back and forth over the cultivar for hours! And 'Empress Wu' Hosta... Oh, what a hosta. The biggest hosta in cultivation. Was it 2014 or 2015 when we planted it? And which year was it that 'Empress Wu' got shredded by a hail storm on April 25th? The date easily remembered because we were out to dinner for Emma's birthday when that storm went through! None of it was wr



easily remembered because we were out to dinner for Emma's birthday when that storm went through! None of it was written down though. This is such a great example of "do as I say and not as I do!" If you want to put a giant smile on the face of your favorite garden center or plant sale associate think about the following:

- 1. Just save all of your tags in the kitchen junk drawer wrapped in a rubber band. They will be so much more valuable than that charger cord for the iPhone 3GS you threw away in 2012.
- 2. Take those tags and bury them just below the soil surface next to the plant and find them when needed. Bring out your inner Indiana Jones.
- 3. Be a professional! Database or spreadsheet that stuff. What it is, where it came from, when you planted it, did it die, did it thrive, did the Japanese beetles make you want to use a flame thrower, or was it simply the right plant in the right place?

Or, just do as I do and try to remember......

WELCOME OUR NEW APPRENTICES!









DONOR SPOTLIGHT LORETTA SHEARER AND SUSAN BENTLEY



Lois U. Davis had a real zest for life and it was contagious to the people she called friends. Two of her friends, Loretta Shearer and Susan Bentley, fondly describe Lois as an extraordinary person who both feel lucky to have known. The women met Lois through her husband Lawrence, a physician who was a mentor to Loretta and Susan when they were starting out as doctors. Lois eventually came to befriend both women and introduced them to each other. Susan and Loretta describe her as a warm, humorous person with a wide array of talents and interests – from travel, to teaching, to jewelry making to music. Lois excelled at all she set her mind to.

Lois, also an avid gardener, was an early fan and member of Yew Dell. Loretta and Susan recalled hearing about the botanical garden for the first time from Lois. She would call them when Yew Dell had an event or live music and tell them they needed to come out with her to this special place.

When Lois passed away, Loretta and Susan initially wondered what would be the best tribute to someone so remarkable and with so many different passions. Her friends thought such a special person needed a special place to be remembered. Lois often gifted trees and plants when her friends lost loved ones and they thought the gardens at Yew Dell seemed a fitting place to memorialize Lois. They chose a shady spot in our fern garden along the beech path for their friend's memorial bench because ferns were Lois' favorite plant. Loretta shared "When we go out to Yew Dell, we think about Lois and talk about our memories of her. When we sit on her bench, I can really feel her presence there."

During her lifetime, Lois fell in love with Yew Dell and brought many friends out to support it. We at Yew Dell are thankful for Susan and Loretta for choosing our gardens as a place to memorialize Lois and for their ongoing support of the Lois U Davis Memorial Fern Garden.
