




YEW DELL GARDENS TWILIGHT IN THE GARDEN GALA



Have we seen the last of the damage from the big spring freeze?

This was certainly one of the toughest winters/springs any of us can remember in years - the very cold early weather (8F the first week of December) followed by warm, then three Jan/Feb weeks that barely broke 35F, four late Feb. days near 80F, and then finally the real killer, 17F on Easter weekend. There was a great deal of immediate damage (the Emmenopterys in my yard looked like a bacon tree!) but that has not been the end of the story. Even as late as early July at Yew Dell, we were seeing new signs of damage in the form of bark falling off large old hollies and other plants, and don't be surprised if something else shows up even now. The best advise at this point, as has been the case all spring and summer, is to simply practice good, middle of the road common sense gardening. Don't overdo the fertilizer. Just keep the soil reasonably moist. Just keep an extra eye on your plants for unusual signs and let us know what you see. We'll report what we see and hear as time goes on. Just remember, there's always next year!







Bloom Garden Shines in its First Year

New gardens are great fun, especially the first year as new plants develop. This is when the watchful gardener is amazed by some wonderful unplanned combinations, and occasionally squints a bit at those that might just need a little adjustment. That's what gardening is all about.

Watching Yew Dell's newest garden unfold this summer has been a true joy. The mountains of work put in by more than 200 volunteers last September has paid great dividends this summer. The plants have just jumped out of the ground for a tremendous display. And with that early performance, we thought it might be a good time to share some of the real winners in the garden so far.

Midsummer is a great time for the coneflowers (*Echinacea*) and this has been no exception. Without a doubt, the three stand-out performers so far have been *Echinacea* 'Hope', 'Fragrant Angel' and 'Kim's Knee High'. The first two are from Dan Heims of Terra Nova Nursery in Oregon. Both are tremendously fragrant, sturdy growers that just seem to produce non-stop through the summer. 'Hope' bears petals of soft pale pink while 'Fragrant Angel' is pure white and a major improvement over the older 'White Swan'. 'Kim's Knee High' is one of the brightest colored coneflowers, with huge crops of a screaming graded shade from purple to almost magenta. But an added plus here is the smaller stature — a selection that tops out at about 2.5' tall. A bit of a disappointment has been 'Bravado' a selection that has gotten lots

of press but so far, has turned out to be just a sort of run-of-the-mill purple coneflower.

Another member of the composite family is the *Rudbeckia maxima*, a true giant in the garden often growing to 8' tall or more. This plant sports typical *Rudbeckia* flowers of brown center and bright golden around, but is usually most noted for its foliage. The leaves are huge and brilliantly colored a striking bluish-gray. This is an excellent textural plant in the summer garden.

Two final winners come as recommendations from Yew Dell's garden manager JoAnne Fischer and our super volunteer curator and plant database manager Abi Rennekamp. From these two great gardeners comes the recognition of *Eupatorium rugosum* 'Chocolate', an outstanding mostly foliage plant with rich burgundy foliage on a dense grower to about 4'. In the garden, it has made for excellent contrast with the gold foliage of *Rhus typhina* 'Bailtiger' Tiger EyesTM. Lastly comes what has just been named the Perennial Plant of the Yew For 2008, *Geranium* 'Gerwat' (Rozanne). It seems appropriate that this Adrian Bloom selection would be such a wonderful performer in Adrian's garden at Yew Dell. A vigorous spreading mount of medium green foliage just seems to drip with masses of light purple flowers. It is well worth the visit to come see. While you are here, pick out your favorite. Maybe the next article will be "visitors' favorites!"

Caroline Breeden's love of gardening drew her to Yew Dell in its early stages of rehabilitation. Now, five years later, she comes to the gardens twice a week to help maintain the exceptional grounds.

In the beginning, she helped tear out runaway ivy and put in new plants, anticipating Yew Dell would be an educational environment.

"I have a large garden of my own, and I thought this would be a great place to learn," she said. She enjoys the

opportunity to learn more about the plants, as well as learning to identify insect damage.

Each week, Breeden comes to Yew Dell on Wednesday morning to tend to the Sunken Garden, then back on Thursday mornings to work on the Bloom Garden.

The Sunken Garden group has been coming on Wednesdays for some time, caring for the unique alpine-style rock garden. A lot of effort went into making the Sunken Garden the standout it is today, including removing the heavy clay soil and replacing it with a well-drained planting mix.

Breeden and the other Sunken Garden volunteers track the bloom time and performance of all plants, a major contribution to Yew Dell's ongoing evaluation and development program.

But working in the Sunken Garden, which looks out to Yew Dell's latest addition, the Bloom Garden, made Breeden realize her assistance was need there as well.



"It was bad," she said. Just planted in September 2006, the Bloom Garden needed more attention to coax the plants into their best shape. She organized a group of volunteers, and began a three-hour session on Thursdays. "It's fun to work with everybody," she said. "You get a group together and everything goes faster." Working in a group means she meets a lot of nice people, she said, plus she sees the results of her work more immediately. Her hard efforts have not gone unnoticed by Yew Dell's staff.

"Caroline is truly a gardener's gardener," Dr. Paul Cappiello, Yew Dell's executive director, said. "She has incredible energy and uncommon focus and determination on her garden projects, but still manages to make it fun for herself and all the others around her."

Now retired, Breeden likes to spend at least five hours a day in her own garden, trying to stay ahead of everything. Her experience at Yew Dell has given her additional skills to use at home, and her work at Yew Dell has definitely shaped it into the amazing place it is today.


