With design leadership from Richard Hartlage and his team at LandMorphology, the end result is a synergistic soup that involved so many of our staff, our general contractor partners at E-Z Construction, and without question, the constant encouragement of so many friends, members, donors, and volunteers, who through it all, kept urging us along the long and winding road.

Whether it's for a Castle Gardens ribbon cutting, or a class or a concert, lunch at Martha Lee's Kitchen, the Fairy Forest with the kids, or a hike on the trails, this is the season... the year, to make Yew Dell a habit. Come often. Stay as long as you like. And make a few memories that you might just reflect on, 20 years down the road.

Spring Doesn't Last Forever

Top Reasons to Visit Yew Dell This Spring

Whether you come every week or haven't been in years, **this** is the spring to come early and come often.

As Ferris Bueller says, "life moves pretty fast. If you don't stop and look around, you could miss it."

In the garden, **things come and go in a flash.** Whether it's the delicate perfume of winter-blooming witch hazels, fleeting shades of a woodland wildflower, or those stunning deciduous magnolias that make us all go weak in the knees, spring is the, "if you snooze you lose" time of year.

Coming out regularly is the only way to catch it all.

But since we all need an occasional kick in the pants, we're shining up our boot tips to provide a little extra encouragement. In the spirit of our efforts to be more *in the moment in the garden*, we will be turning to our social media (Facebook & Instagram) feeds to cue you in to those ephemeral garden happenings that so often vanish before we have a chance to take them in. Magnolias pop into full bloom but it's gonna freeze in two days? We might just announce a **last minute**, **pre-freeze magnolia walk**. Something cool emerged from the raised beds in the nursery? Don't be surprised if Jeff puts out the word.


Of course we're secretly hoping that by committing to cueing you all in to all these micro-moments in the garden, it'll hold our feet to the fire so we keep our eyes open too!

Sing it with me... 27,000 flowering bulbs in the ground, 27,000 flowering bulbs...

Sayde and her team have really done it this year. And it's not just the 27,000 bulbs planted last fall. It's 27,000 NEW bulbs added to the staggering number already in the ground. It took a year's worth of planning color combinations, sequential timing charts (Someday, let us tell you about Sayde's spreadsheets!), and bed rotations to keep disease organisms from building up on one species over multiple seasons. Honestly, if Hannibal had Sayde and her team in charge of planning and logistics when he crossed the mountains to invade Rome, history might have taken a very different course!

And remember, **The Big Bloom** isn't some one-and-done affair. From the earliest **snowdrops** (*Galanthus* species) in February to the **screaming blue sqiulls** (*Scilla* species), the **hyacinths and tulips**, and rounding out with the late ornamental onions (*Alliums*) and *Fritillarias*, this is a show that goes on February through June.

So make Ferris happy. The spring garden moves pretty fast. If you don't take a minute, you might just miss it!



You asked for it. We're Open!

Literally... you did. For the last few years, more and more visitors have been asking for us **to open up earlier in the season**. And sure, it might seem completely obvious to all of you, but we finally scratched our collective head and said to our collective self, "hey, if we're trying to get people to appreciate the magic of the early spring garden, wouldn't it help to actually be open that time of year?"



Each year a panel of Kentucky green industry professionals hunkers down and battles it out to see which plant nominees are deemed the Theodore Klein Award winners. These awards started back in 1999 and now add up to the go-to collection of woody and herbaceous garden plants for the region.

Silver Linden

(Tilia tomentosa 'Sterling')

A tree growing vigorously to 50' tall with a uniform outline, dense shade with leaves of deep green above and silver beneath, turning brilliant gold in fall. Late spring, creamy yellow flowers are sweetly fragrant. Super support for bees. Best in full sun.



Giant Dogwood

(Cornus controversa 'June Snow - JFS' June Snow™)

Stunning 20-30'-tall, broad spreading tree with attractive, horizontal branching. It is prized for its early summer, creamy white blooms that attract a wide range of pollinators and its excellent red/maroon fall foliage. Fall blue/black fruit are attractive to many birds. Grows best in full sun or part shade.



Dwarf Nine Bark

(Physocarpus opulifolius 'SMNPOTW' Tiny Wine®)

Dwarf, burgundy leafed selection of this North American native makes a dense, fine textured mound to 3-4' tall and wide. The dark foliage makes excellent contrast with late spring masses of lightly fragrant white/pink flowers. Tough, durable shrub that looks good all summer. Best in full sun or light shade.



Dwarf Hinoki Falsecypress

(Chamaecyparis obtusa dwarf cultivars)

Diverse group of low growing, sculptural, compact evergreens maturing at 3' to 8' depending on cultivar. Many varieties available with either bright or dark green or bright gold foliage. Best in full sun or light shade. Useful as a featured specimen, container plant, or in as a rock garden specimen.



Blue Star Amsonia

(Amsonia tabernaemontana 'Storm Cloud')

Native North American sun plant that forms dense masses of erect stems to about 3' tall, topped with sky blue flowers in spring. 'Storm Cloud' is a very vigorous form with deep, almost black stems and heavy flowering. Best in full sun and well-drained soil.



Evergreen Solomon Seal

(Disporopsis pernyi)

Stunning low groundcover to about 12" tall with evergreen (down to about 8° F) glossy, deep green leaves. Spring flowers are white/green bells to about 34" long, hanging below the foliage. Modest spreader, easy to grow with average moisture and full to light shade.

VOLUNTEER HIGHLIGHTS


